Report

From the Dean

through time, talent, and treasure we would struggle to flourish as a system.

This year, I want to take a slightly different angle on the notion of stewardship. What if I invited you to not think of stewardship as a monetary donation, but an act of respect and reverence for RCS? It wouldn't surprise me if your initial reaction would be confusion. Still, I promise you, the idea of reverencing RCS and being good stewards of our system is not as divergent of a vision as you would think.

To begin, what do we mean when we speak of "reverence" in the Catholic tradition? The most basic definitions are to treat holy things in a holy manner and to treat God's gifts as gifts with love, dignity, and respect. To not treat holy things in a holy manner and to neglect God's gifts is the heart of the sin of desecration. When put into these terms, we can see that reverence is far broader than how a priest celebrates the Mass or how a teacher enthrones the Bible in their classroom. The term also asks us, "Do we treat the gift of Regis Catholic Schools as a gift from God or not?"

Here are some questions for you to consider supporting this broader understanding of stewardship. Do you want Regis students to receive the best education they can? Do you want them to have cocurricular activities to help foster their

Named New Regis Middle & High School Principal

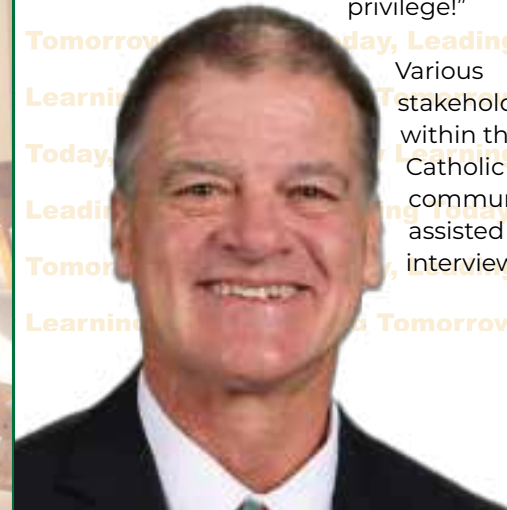
Coming home to Regis is an honor and a privilege!

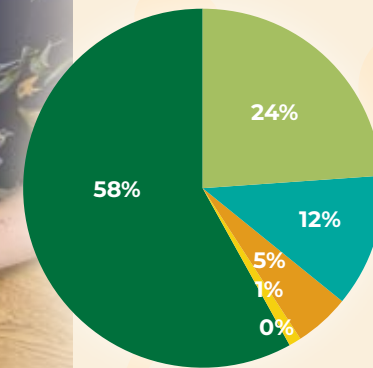
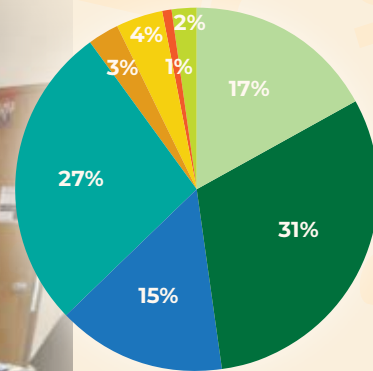

Projects like the Regis campus gymnasium renovation don't happen often. This leaves a bit of mystique as to how they come to fruition. Now that we have essentially concluded the project, it is nice to share a bit of a recap of the current status of this newly renovated space.



The gymnasium is functional and currently being used by our volleyball teams, physical education classes, basketball teams, and others. Additionally, the gymnasium hosted the inaugural Rambler Royale Casino Night in September and a special robotics demonstration by the Pablo Center.

An observation from the inaugural volleyball match hosted by Regis this season included an increased level of energy and perhaps even attendance in the gym. Spectators are naturally curious and seemed glad to be present at the inaugural competition held in the gym since the completion of the project. Positive comments were overheard, including a senior student spectator from a rival school, saying "wow, this gym is awesome"!

While there is much positive to share and describe about the new gym's feel and functionality, it is important to remember that using the gym is much like using a new remote control for a technology device. One continues to identify more buttons that provide advanced functionality. While it is great to see the gym being utilized and enjoyed, there is reason to believe that the functionality of the videotron and other technological components will be expanded and run smoother as our experience grows in using them.

Much gratitude has been shared by those using the gymnasium. But akin to moving into a new home, it does take time to settle in, finetune technology settings, and utilize components to their full capability. The experience for those using the gym today appears positive and perhaps a significant upgrade to the pre-project gym. With that said, there is still room for optimism that the

experience will age like a fine wine and keep getting a little better with the passage of time.

Coming into the 2024 season, the Regis Volleyball program knew it was going to be a special year. Preparation began as early as June 1 with weight lifting, open gyms, summer league, and camps. You name it, we were doing it. With a program of just 33 girls for three teams, athletes at all levels (C-Team, JV, V) were quick to get to work in August preparing for what was set to be an extraordinary year. Throughout the season, we saw each team face challenges and overcome obstacles - including preparing in an unfamiliar gym while our newly renovated gym received its finishing touches in September. The minute we came home to Regis, you could see the dynamic and energy of our athletes really ramp up.

Winning the Western Cloverbelt in a hard-fought 5-set match with McDonnell was something we were incredibly proud of this season. Our conference is one of the best in the area generally when it comes to volleyball - so winning that is an accomplishment in itself. The cherry on top was traveling to Marshfield to beat Columbus Catholic and winning that Crossover

Championship game. The success continued during playoffs with wins over Thorp, Elmwood-Plum City, Webster, and Cochrane-Fountain City to earn a bid to the state tournament. Our entire program and our fans were so proud to have had the opportunity to get to state and to show our team what it means to remain perfect throughout the playoffs. Making it to that point has given many girls in our program the taste of what it could be like to win gold, so we're already looking forward to getting to work towards that goal again next year.

At state, our team showed incredible resiliency with a comeback win in the semi-final match against Mineral Point. While we may have come up just shy of a gold ball against Manitowoc Lutheran, all who watched and participated in the match would agree that Regis made them earn their title. We're proud to have brought a silver ball back to Regis for the first time since 2013 and are excited to go for gold next year.

On behalf of the program, we'd like to specifically thank our four seniors (Ava S., Sydney M., Megan B., and Jacelin J.) for their incredible leadership and dedication to our program over the last four years. Our program has some incredibly large shoes to fill losing these four incredible young women next year.

Girls Golf

GIRLS TEAM

The girls started the season with 12 runners, the most a Regis team has fielded in years. Freshmen Emerson Moore, Avalina Antonia, Claire Ernster, and Evelyn Sykora made an immediate impact. This team had five seniors, so the young athletes will have to fill some big shoes. Sophomore Kaylen Borst was the team's solid 3rd runner this season and made the Cloverbelt Conference Honorable Mention team. Junior Mady Haus joined this year and made the WIAA sectional team. Two seniors joined XC for the first time; Eva Wesolowski and Claire Sykora. These two runners made trying a new sport look easy! They improved all season long and the team was fortunate to get to know them. Junior Sylvia Spanger, also a co-captain, was the only Rambler to qualify for the WIAA state meet. Sylvia made the 2nd team Cloverbelt All-Conference Team and earned WIAA All-Academic honors. She placed 6th at the sectional race, running a lifetime personal best to move onto the big stage! Seniors Rebecca Catt, Grace Market, and Carly Borst all ran season best times at the sectional meet. Carly Borst, the only 4-year letter winner, 3x state qualifier, and co-captain, brought wisdom and dedication to this team and will be deeply missed. Carly was a 4x Cloverbelt Conference first-team member. Rebecca saved her best races for last, especially the last two meets. Grace had a healthy season, and she was able to run in the team's top five at the sectional and conference meets. The team was named as the Cloverbelt Runners-Up after placing 3rd in 2023.

Both teams were fortunate to have Coach Beth Borst on staff, along with volunteer coaches Tim Santine and Justin Patchin. The coaching staff was exceptional. Their wisdom, experience, passion, and dedication to the 21 runners was appreciated and Coach Yengo thanks all three of them for their unyielding support.

BOYS TEAM

Nine boys raced this season and had their best showing since 2011, placing 3rd at WIAA Sectionals. (The team placed 9th in 2023). They were also Cloverbelt Conference Runners-Up, after placing 8th in 2023. It was an exciting season with three freshmen, one senior, four sophomores, and one junior.

Co-captain Dominic Santine was the top runner all season earning Cloverbelt Conference first-team honors and placing 9th at the WIAA sectional meet. The doubles team of Cara Olson and Malia Kassing qualified for the WIAA Individual State Tournament

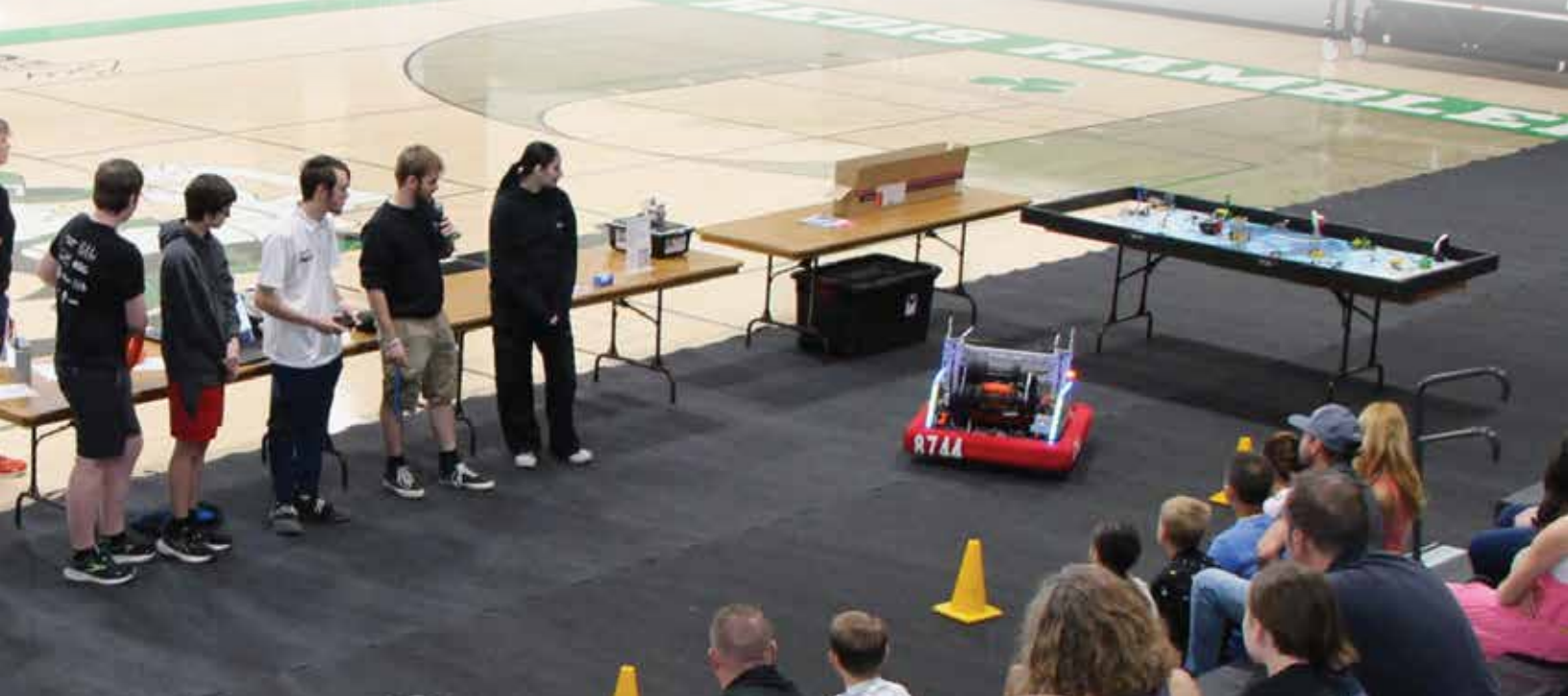
