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The Essence of Reverence

In this edition of the Rambler Report, you will encounter the recurring theme of stewardship.

through time, talent, and treasure we would struggle to flourish as a system.

This year, I want to take a slightly different angle on the notion of stewardship. What if I invited you to not think of stewardship as a monetary donation, but an act of respect and reverence for RCS? It wouldn't surprise me if your initial reaction would be confusion. Still, I promise you, the idea of reverencing RCS and being good stewards of our system is not as divergent of a vision as you would think.

To begin, what do we mean when we speak of "reverence" in the Catholic tradition? The most basic definitions are to treat holy things in a holy manner and to treat God's gifts as gifts with love, dignity, and respect. To not treat holy things in a holy manner and to neglect God's gifts is the heart of the sin of desecration. When put into these terms, we can see that reverence is far broader than how a priest celebrates the Mass or how a teacher enthrones the Bible in their classroom. The term also asks us, "Do we treat the gift of Regis Catholic Schools as a gift from God or not?"

Here are some questions for you to consider supporting this broader understanding of stewardship. Do you want Regis students to receive the best education they can? Do you want them to have cocurricular activities to help foster their human and social development? Do you want your child to grow in love with God and live with a desire for eternal life with the communion of saints? To me, answering these questions in the affirmative means you wish to reverence the Regis community. And what if we saw donating to Regis as less of a question of personal and communal finance and more as simply a number that symbolizes the material investment needed to foster true spiritual wealth?

Do you have the heart to reverence Regis? Do you desire to create the culture I mentioned earlier? If so, what number symbolizes that commitment? Is there even a limit as to what that number should be?

Thank you for your past support of Regis. Thank you for your future support of Regis. And if you find yourself only able to support Regis through time and talent, know that those gifts are equally important. Let us strive to be good stewards of RCS. Let us treat our youth as gifts from God and build them up as such.
