Culture of Life Essay Contest Winners

Several students from Regis Middle and High School were selected as winners in the annual Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus Culture of Life Essay Contest

The contest is open to Catholic students in grades 7 through 12. This year, there were more than 150 total entries from the Regis Catholic Schools system and regional winners were selected across all grade levels.

"The Culture of Life Essay Contest is a staple in our curriculum and has been for many years," said religion teacher Ellen Killian. "We are fortunate to have a strong connection with the local Knights of Columbus JFK Council #1257."

This year's topic was "Slavery vs. Abortion: Are they the Same?" and the essays were judged at the local Council and Diocesan (Regional) levels. First and second place winning essays were forwarded on for state competition.

Alayna Deignan (Grade 10 - Regis High School) won 1st place at the state level in her grade level and Katie Andrews (Grade 7 - Regis Middle School) won honorable mention at the state level in her grade level.

Mrs. Killian says this is the first time she can remember a Regis High

School student taking top honors at the state competition.

"Alayna is a very disciplined student and I am very proud of her accomplishments," she said. "Alayna is very faithful and strives to do well in all that she does. Winning the Culture of Life Essay Contest at the state level is one of the greatest accomplishments a student can earn in my eyes."

"I am so proud of her for winning this award as she may not get noticed upfront as a leader, but indeed is the best in that area."

"I am so proud of all of my students," added Killian. "It is always rewarding to see students do well and it confirms that the classes are effective."

In announcing the winners, Knights of Columbus State Program Director William Frayer said, "These essays showed excellent work and tremendous insight into the depth of this issue in our society today! We congratulate and commend these students for their outstanding efforts."

The Knights of Columbus is the world's largest Catholic men's fraternal organization with more than 1.9 million members globally and more than 36,000 in Wisconsin.

To realize her dream of studying abroad, Olivia Huang boarded a plane three years ago and flew more than 6,800 miles to attend Regis High School.

The 19-year-old international student from China will graduate with 63 classmates next week, and after spending part of the summer in her homeland, she'll return to the U.S. to pursue a business degree at Boston University.

"I feel like I will miss here," Huang said of Regis and Eau Claire. "It's my first stop in America, I tried lots of different activities here, and I made friends here."

Regis attracts six to 10 international students each year, said Kendra Pagel, the high school's guidance counselor.

"She has been a blessing," Pagel said of Huang, who impressed her during a Skype interview before the teen came to the U.S.

"She had a bright, bright personality right off the bat, so I knew she would be a good fit at Regis," Pagel said. "And she has been. She became super involved with extracurricular

activities and did well academically. She is just an outstanding student."

Huang is a native of Hangzhou, the capital of Zhejiang Province in eastern China. There she lives with her parents, Zhican Huang and Xinrong Yu. She also has an older sister, Ling Huang.

Wanting to experience a different culture, Olivia Huang worked with an agency to find a school in the United States. She considered five or six before

deciding on Regis High School.

“The U.S. is the top country,” said Huang, who has attained a 3.89 grade-point average at Regis. “I want to major in business and figured the U.S. was a good place to learn about economy.”

“Regis is academically good,” said Huang, noting many of the Catholic high school’s students go on to college after graduation. “The people (also) are really nice.”

Huang arrived in Eau Claire the summer before the start of her sophomore year at Regis. While Eau Claire, by comparison, is much smaller and less crowded

than Hangzhou, which has a population of more than 7.86 million, according to chinatouronline.com, Huang was impressed by the friendliness of the Wisconsin city’s residents and the amount of green space.

“It’s a place I’d like to be when I retire,” said Huang, who has spent much of the last three years living with two host families. (Each year since her arrival in Eau Claire, she has returned to China once or twice.)

Initially, Huang, who has studied the English language since elementary school, found her American classes a bit difficult because of the

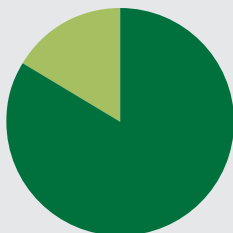
speed at which people talked. In addition, while she is good at math, she didn’t recognize some of the terms.

However, her teachers and fellow students were very helpful. They also were curious about China, Huang said, noting a popular question from classmates was how to spell their names in Chinese.

“Would I do this all over again?” Huang asked. “Yes, I’m pretty sure that I’ve learned a lot. (Since I’ve been here,) my family can tell I’m different.”

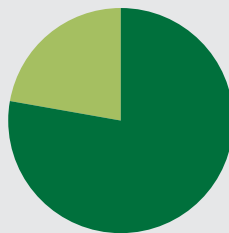
2016 Regis High School Senior Exit Survey

Did you have a positive learning experience at Regis High School?



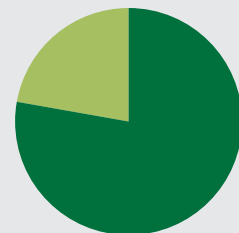

Did you feel you received challenging subject matter in the courses you took at Regis High School?



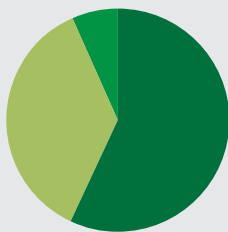
78% Yes 22% No

Did your teachers have high expectations for quality work?



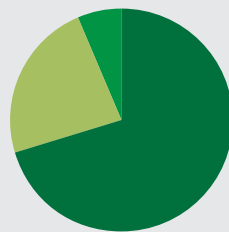

Overall, how would you rate the learning environment at Regis High School?



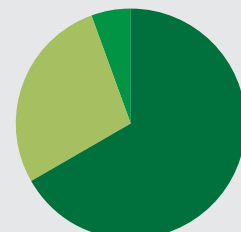

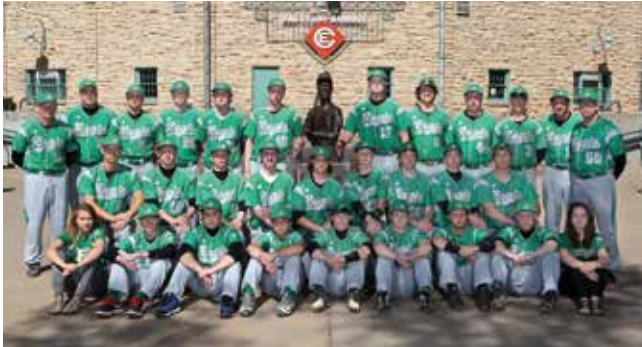

Athletics Report



Baseball

The 2016 Regis Baseball season was a successful one. Finishing with an overall record of 16-7 and a Western Cloverbelt record of 8-6, which was good for third place, the 2016 season winning percentage of .696 was the program's highest since the 2005 squad went 15-6 with a winning percentage of .714.

The 16 wins also helped the team capture their first WIAA Regional title and Sectional appearance since 2007.

Individual honors were plentiful. All-Conference awards went to Paul Petit (1st Team), Matt McCann and Jacob Salonek (2nd Team) and Caleb Brickner and Alex Rocksvold (Honorable Mention). The Wisconsin Baseball Coaches Association bestowed All-District honors on Paul Petit (1st Team Infield) and Matt McCann (Honorable Mention Infield).



Boys Golf

2016 marked the first year of a new cooperative in Boys Golf for McDonell and Regis High Schools. Twelve student athletes, four from Regis and eight from McDonell, participated in the Cloverbelt Conference Varsity and Junior Varsity schedule of matches and the WIAA Tournament this past spring.

Thomas Longbella and Grant Sandberg worked as a potent one-two punch as they finished 1st and 2nd in the Cloverbelt Conference Championship and WIAA Division 2 Black River Falls Regional. The two players also earned All-Conference honors.



Girls Soccer

The Regis-McDonell Girls Soccer team finished the 2016 season with a 12-7-1 record. The team reached the WIAA Sectional Semi-Finals before losing to Northland Pines. Overall, it was an excellent season, with the team out-scoring opponents 63-21. The team graduates seniors Katie Hayes, Lizzy Shinnars, Regan Alexander, Hannah Gibbons, Taya Kremer, Molly Schwandt and Maggie Meinen.



Softball

The 2016 Regis Softball team is proud to have won the WIAA Division 3 Regional Championship! After earning the #3 seed and a first round bye, the team defeated Mondovi 3-2 and Cadott 2-0 behind two 10 strikeout pitching performances by sophomore Audrey Newby. The Ramblers lost to Elk Mound in the WIAA Sectionals.

Regis captured 3rd place in the Western Cloverbelt Conference with a 9-5 record finishing behind Division 4 State Champion, Thorp and McDonell Central.

All-Conference awards went to Audrey Newby (1st Team) and Grace Gilles and Lauren Clark (2nd Team).

Overall, the Ramblers finished 11-8, improving over the 2015 record of 8-12. In addition to Clark, the team graduates seniors Margaret Killian, Lauren Newby, Molly Smoczyk, Sarah Liming and Katie Wallace.

Track & Field

The Regis Boys and Girls Track teams had another successful season in 2016. Although there were fewer victories than in the past, many personal records were set by the 27 boys and 18 girls and the teams got gradually better as the season progressed.



The Girls team won the Cadott Invite, placed third at the Cloverbelt Conference meet, won the WIAA Regional and finished second at the WIAA Sectional.

At the 2016 WIAA State Track & Field Championships, senior Kayla Neff broke the school record in the Long Jump with a leap of 17'8.50", good enough for third.
